Also recently, at this year's Worldcon, Dan's promotional art for the film *Hellboy 2* won the 2009 Chesley Award for Best Product Illustration.




Registration

Act now to get the discounted preregistration rates. After March 10 the at-the-door rates will be in effect. Am I already registered? Look at the mail label on the back cover for your status. Your badge name will also be there for verification.

There are four methods available to register for Minicon 45:

- 2. fill out a reg form and mail it with a check (one is included with this PR and it's also available on the reg site)



- get a reg form from us in person and give it back with a check (this works for parties we throw at other cons, special events like Brandon's recent signing, some MnStf events, etc)
- in the unusual circumstance that the above methods just cannot get a reg form into your hot little hands, our reg head *may* be bribed with neat socks or cookies into mailing you one

Author Guest of Honor Brandon Sanderson

Brandon Sanderson spent his childhood in Lincoln, Nebraska. While he was in junior high school, he discovered science fiction and fantasy novels, and was transformed from a reluctant reader into a voracious reader. It was also at this time that Brandon tried to write his first book. "It was dreadful," he says.




Later Brandon studied at Brigham Young University, graduating with his BA in English in 2000, and his Master's in Creative Writing in 2005. Brandon wrote thirteen novels before selling one, but now makes his living as a full-time writer. Brandon's published works include the *Mistborn* trilogy and other epic fantasy novels released by Tor Books, as well as the *Alcatraz Smedry* series, which is middlegrade fantasy/adventure from Scholastic Press. In December of 2007 Brandon was asked to complete the last book in Robert Jordan's *Wheel of Time* series. Brandon teaches a creative writing class at BYU in Provo, Utah, where he lives with his wife and son.

Dan's work spans a variety of genres, including novels, comics and film. He has worked for such clients as Disney, Universal Studios, Boeing Aircraft, Saatchi & Saatchi, Scholastic Books, Ace Books, The Greenwich Workshop, Penguin Books, Random House, Bantam Books, Tor Books, UpperDeck, Wizards of the Coast, and Dark Horse Comics. Aside from freelance

illustration, Dan also co-hosts a series of instructional demonstrations called *Art Out Loud*.

Dan has been the recipient of many awards. Most recently, he has received the 2007 Jack Gaughan Award for Best Emerging Artist, and was the Chesley Award winner for Best Paperback Cover of 2007. 


Art is a thread that runs through every part of Minicon, from our publications, to our full-color badges, to our con T-shirt.

The Fentasia Awards are an anti-masquerade. There are judges, prizes, and categories, but no all-day prep and no stress. In the spirit of informality there is a "geek duds" category ~ that stuff that isn't necessarily a "costume" but you only wear at cons. The Fenfare Parade will commence directly after the Awards. We will traipse all throughout the fen spaces, occasionally pausing to show off, and end in the consuite (just in time for beer! at least for us old farts).

These events are meant to be fun and easy. Performance bits are neither required nor discouraged. If you know you want to do one, please contact the Cos Team in advance; we'd like to plan ahead some. That being said, if you show up at the parade and say "I want to do a bit!", we won't spank you. *Unlike Cadsuane!*
